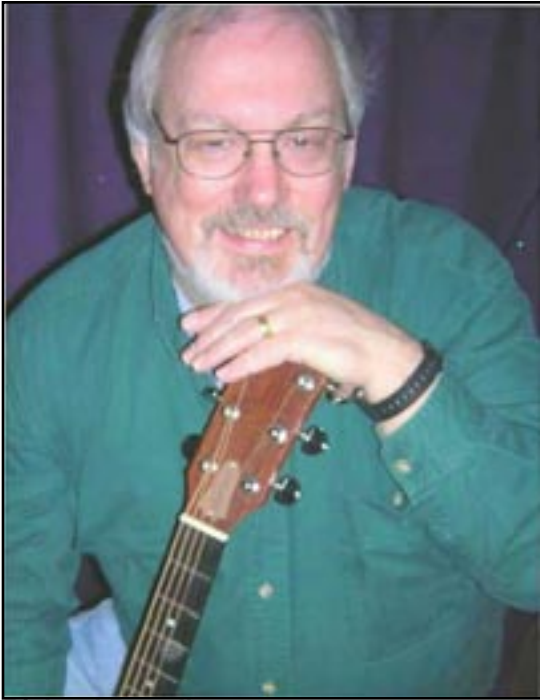

Help Increase the Peace Program builds non-violent relationships on good conflict resolution and communication skills and the practice of cooperation through games and role plays. Diverse youth and their allies model mutually respectful and caring relationships and enhance self-esteem through fun activities and elicitive learning. Youth are empowered to practice leadership skills and engage with issues of social and economic justice.

Are you a young person or an ally to young people? Do you want to make a difference with youth in their understanding of how to deal with conflict and with others who are different from themselves? Are you interested in developing leadership skills? Want to reduce violence in your community? Learn skills for cooperation and how to build cooperative relationships.

Are you frustrated with programs that are so boring the young people can't sit still to learn this information? Come and experience a program that is dynamic, interactive, and elicitive.

Help Increase the Peace Program (HIPP), based on the Alternatives to Violence Program, can help you communicate effectively with young people about the issues which are on their minds. Experience HIPP training and learn how to present it. Become a certified facilitator at one of these five day institutes.

You are invited to a potluck & Quaker dialogue at William Penn House, Sunday, April 3, 2005, at 6:30 PM. Our Program this First Day is presented by **Scott Stedjan**, Coordinator, U.S. Campaign to Ban Landmines, Legislative Associate, Friends Committee on National Legislation (Quakers)

Scott Stedjan works as a Legislative Associate with the Friends Committee on National Legislation (FCNL), a Quaker lobby in the public interest that brings the concerns, experiences and testimonies of the Religious Society of Friends to bear on public policy. He focuses on controlling the trade of conventional weapons, opposing U.S. military assistance to human rights offenders, and landmines. A key component of Scott's work includes serving as the Coordinator of the US Campaign to Ban Landmines (USCBL). The USCBL is a coalition of approximately 500 U.S.-based human rights, humanitarian, faith-based, children's, peace, disability, veterans', medical, development, academic, and environmental organizations dedicated to a total ban on antipersonnel landmines.

Scott holds a Bachelor of Science in Political Science from Messiah College (PA) and a Masters of Science in Human Rights from the London School of Economics and Political Science (UK). He has worked at FCNL since 2002.
